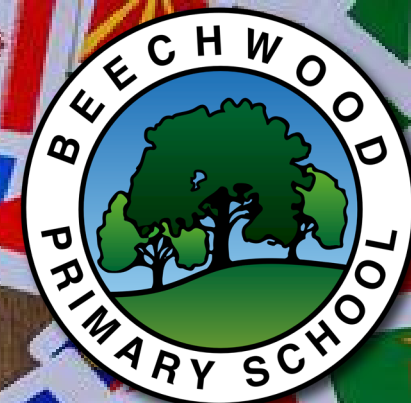
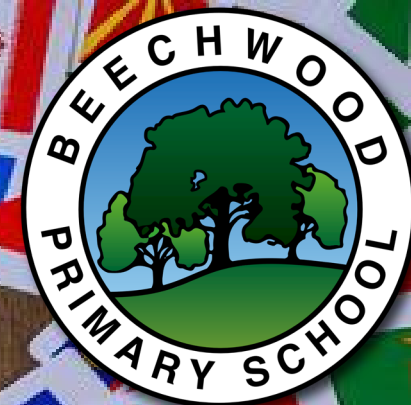

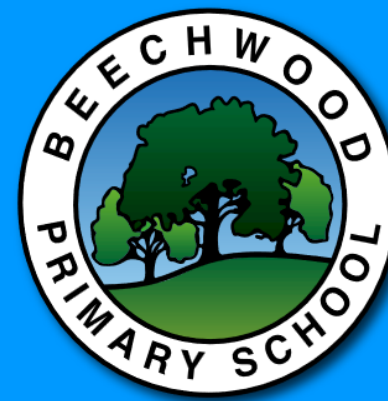

My Dad was born into a big family he was the eldest of 10 children and most of them now live in Canada which I often visit.

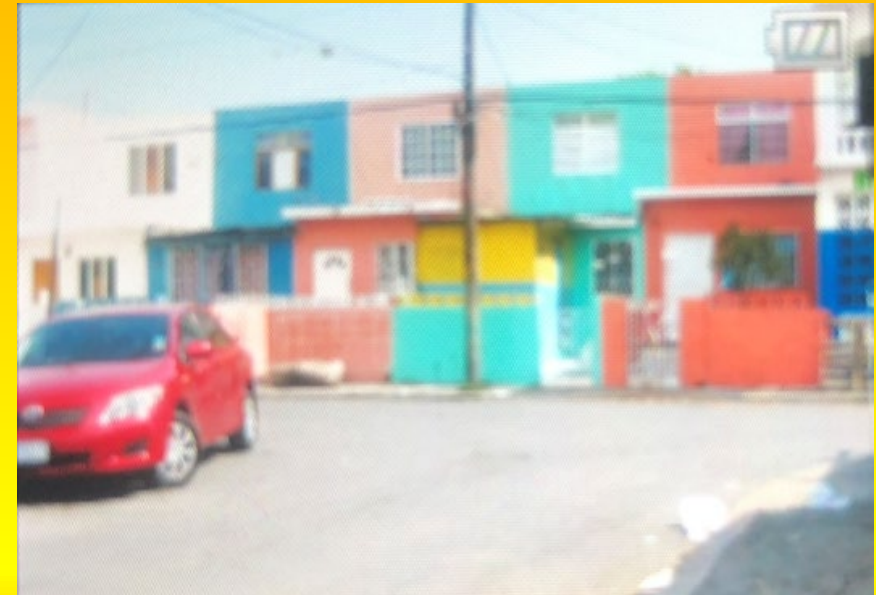
My Mums is one of 5 children and all of her brothers and sisters still live in Leeds and we meet up regularly for family get togethers.

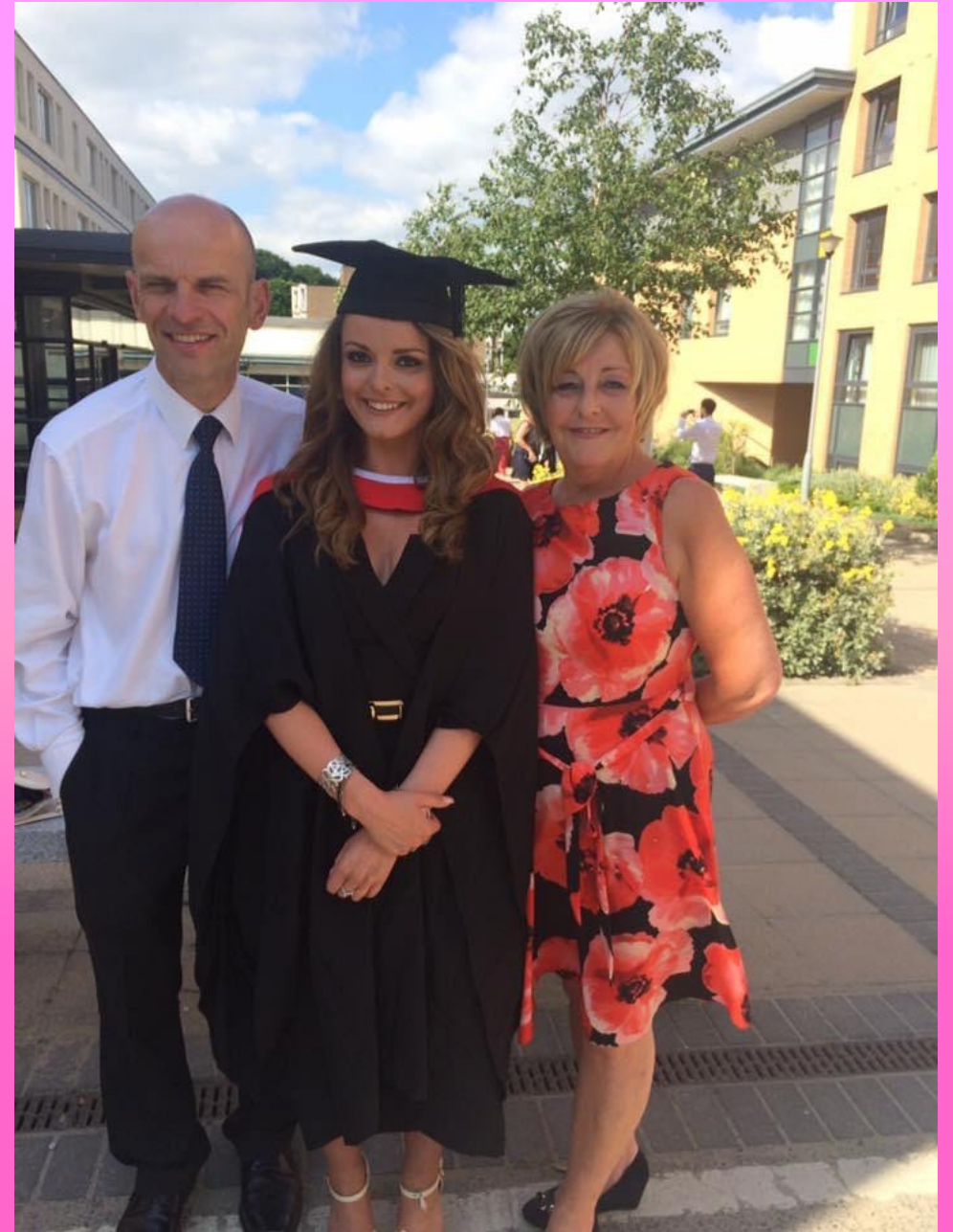
Mum is from Glasgow, Scotland. She speaks with a Scottish accent.

My dad was born in Bradford but his parents with both from different villages in between Bosnia and Serbia. They moved to England due to a war.

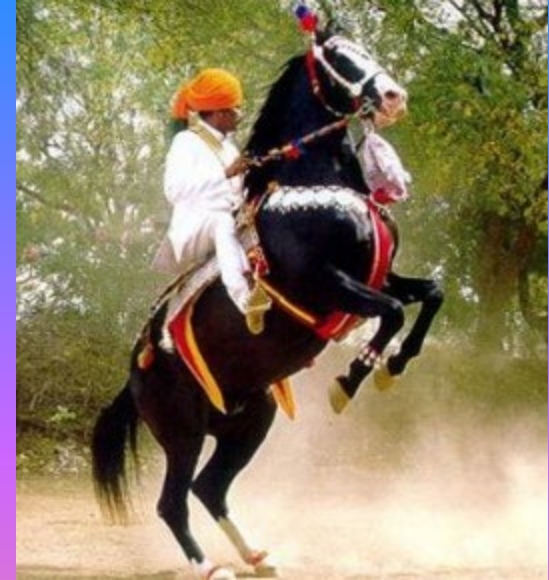
My dad didn't learn English until he started school but now has a Yorkshire accent.

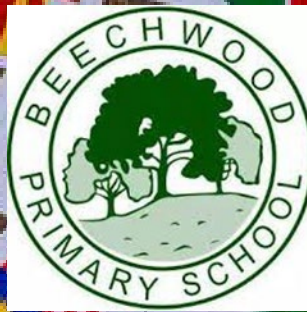
