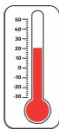


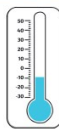
Mammals

Mammals give birth to live young.



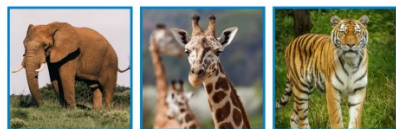
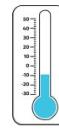
Amphibians

Amphibians are **cold**-blooded.
Amphibians live on land and in the water.
Amphibians lay eggs.
Amphibians have moist skin.
Amphibians have webbed feet.



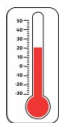
Reptiles

Reptiles are **cold**-blooded.

Reptiles have ear holes, not ears.
Reptiles have dry skin.



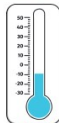
Birds

Birds have two legs.



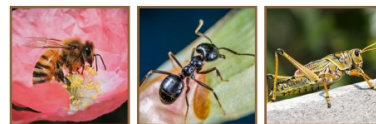
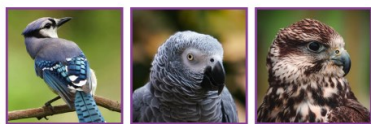
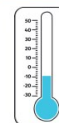
Fish

Fish are **cold**-blooded.

Insects

Insects are **cold**-blooded.
Insects have two antennae.

Most insects hatch from eggs.
A spider is not an insect.

Vertebrates

These are animals with backbones.

Vertebrates are divided into five groups:

1. Mammals
2. Birds
3. Fish
4. Reptiles
5. Amphibians

Some examples of vertebrates:

humans, elephants, cows, dolphins, cats, sparrows, frogs, fish and crocodiles.

Invertebrates

These are animals without backbones.

Invertebrates are divided into further groups. These include:

insects, annelids, protozoa, crustaceans, molluscs, arachnids and echinoderms.

Some examples of invertebrates:

ladybirds, squids, bees, snails, centipedes, wasps and flies.
