Animal: A living thing that is not a human or plant that need food and water to live.

Plant: A plant or part of a plant used as food.

Grow: To become larger by natural development.

Flower: A flower is the part of a plant that blossoms.

Tree: A tall woody plant with a trunk and branches which support leaves.

Soil: A loose mixture which lies on top of land.

Fruit: Grows from a seed and can be eaten.

Vegetable: A plant or part of a plant used as food.



Climate Facts to Learn

Plants including trees are really important for our planet.

Bees rely on flowers to source pollen and nectar.

Plants have the following parts: roots, seedling, stem, leaves and flower.

Plants need water and sunlight to help them to grow

Seeds and bulbs grow into flowers, plants and trees.
