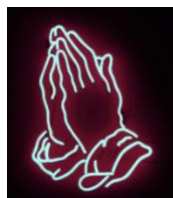

Year 5	Why are some journeys and places special? <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Write prayers/wishes on rice paper and push into gaps in a wall /fence /trellis or other suitable outdoor place.  	What values are shown in codes for living? <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Think of three 'villains' from stories, films or TV series that you love. What makes these people bad? What rules do they break? What does their breaking of a code for living lead to?  Why do Christians Celebrate Christmas? Theme- Epiphany (Gifts and Gift bringers) <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Research Christmas in other countries and link this with beliefs about Jesus. Think about similarities and differences between them and any common themes. Create your own poster.	Should we forgive others? <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Listen to..."Sorry seems to be the hardest word", Blue or Elton John- Why is it hard to say this word? And why is it important? Sorry seems to be the hardest word...	What Makes Easter Important for Christians? Theme- Victory <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Can you think of examples of victory in your own life? (eg: not giving into temptation, standing up for someone, learning a new skill). Write about this. What was your victory? How did it make you feel?	What do Christians believe about the old and new covenants? <u>Home Learning Idea</u> Have you ever made a promise to do something for someone (think about more serious promises e.g. to parents, Brownies, Cubs etc.). <i>Are these promises easy to keep? Have you ever broken a promise?</i> Look at some other examples of promises/agreements that are between two different sets of people e.g. a bank note (I promise to pay...), school rules, Green Cross Code. Remind pupils that a covenant is an agreement or a promise. Explain that for Christians, when God makes a covenant it is a lifelong promise that can never be broken. God's promise to Abraham was passed on through his family and still applies to Christians today as Christians still follow God and believe and trust in his promises. You may be asked to bring in an item (or a picture of one) from home that has been passed down from a previous generation in their family. 	

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
