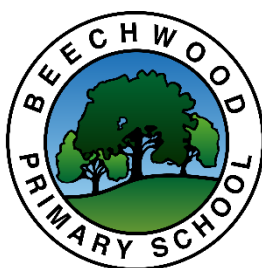


Science in EYFS at Beechwood Primary School



At Beechwood Primary School, we have a nursery and reception. Children who attend receive amazing provision and inputs which introduce them to the world of science. Children are encouraged to communicate in a scientific way: talking about what they see and asking lots of questions. In Nursery and Reception, children are introduced to key scientific principals through their play-based learning and topic work.

Through their Autumn topics, children learn about themselves and become more aware of their bodies. In Spring, children explore concepts of creating mixtures and exploring different materials, the key building blocks of chemistry. The children learn about New Life and are introduced to simple life cycles and classification. This prepares them for Year One, where they will learn more about vertebrates and identifying plants and their parts. In EYFS, the children learn about animals and plants in our immediate area and in other countries. This involves lots of hands-on exploration and creates a solid foundation for biology work in the future. Principals of physics are introduced through 'Understanding the World' work, learning about forces and technology through exploration of the World around them.

Lots of work in EYFS takes place outdoors, with children being able to explore and enjoy the wonders of the natural world around them.

Talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice.
