Dear Parents and Carers,

Outlined below are the lessons your child could and should access if they are unable to attend school for a period during this half term, due to self-isolation etc. We have outlined suitable lessons that match our curriculum for this half term. We recommend your child completes Phonics and Maths lessons daily and Topic sessions in the afternoon.

Please note – this is NOT homework. This is suggested provision for your child only IF they are unable to attend school.

In addition to the below, we would suggest that your child should be reading three times a week.

Subject	Remote lessons to be accessed	Notes
Literacy	Practise saying the sounds all of the letters make. Write all of the letters using the correct Read Write Inc letter formation. handwriting_phrases_v2.pdf (ruthmiskin.com) Read and write words with 3 or 4 sounds such as: pat, fox, bag, hand, frog, list. We call words that be sounded out phonetically 'green words'. Practise reading and writing these 'red' words. Red words cannot be sounded out and just need to be learnt: I, go, to, the, said, he, she, we, me, my, no Write short sentences containing 'red' words and 'green' words, for example: I am a red fox, I go to the shop, We sat on the mat. Physical Development	Find a space. Warm up, play traffic light game. Move like a farm animal. Is it a big/small animal? How does it move? Stretches to cool down. Cosmic Yoga https://www.youtube.com/c/CosmicKidsYoga/videos Fine motor skills: draw some lines, straight, wavy, zig zag. Children to trace over your line with a pen or cut along your line with children's scissors.	
Expressive Arts and Design	Music: Music lessons for Early Years Foundation Stage students - Oak National Academy (thenational.academy) Art: Make a painting by rolling objects in paint. Marbles, toy cars and other things you can roll around (top tip: put your paper in a tray or plastic lid) Blow painting Dab a puddle of watery paint onto thick paper or card and use a straw to blow it out in different directions. Mirror painting Fold a piece of paper in half, unfold, apply thick paint on one side and then squish the paper together.
