

Francophone Day- Friday 25th September

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to let you know that we will be holding a **Francophone Day** in school on Friday 25th September. Francophone means **French-speaking**. On this day, the children will be learning that French is spoken not only in France, but in many countries around the world, including parts of Europe, Africa, North America, the Caribbean and the Indian Ocean.



Throughout the day, children will take part in a range of fun activities linked to French-speaking countries. These may include music, games, food, flags, maps, simple French phrases.

Children are invited to come to school wearing colours linked to the flag of their year group's Francophone country. This is optional and **no money is needed**. Please use clothes or accessories you already have at home.

Flag colours for each year group:

- **EYFS – France:** blue, white and red
- **Year 1 – Canada:** red and white
- **Year 2 – Madagascar:** white, red and green
- **Year 3 – Belgium:** black, yellow and red
- **Year 4 – Ivory Coast:** orange, white and green
- **Year 5 – Senegal:** green, yellow and red
- **Year 6 – Haiti:** blue and red

There will also be a **special Francophone menu** available at lunchtime. Please sign up for this in the usual way using the **SchoolGrid app**.

We would also love to hear from any parents, carers or children who have a connection with a French-speaking country. This might be through family, travel, language, culture, food, music or personal experience. If you would be willing to come into school on the day to share something simple with the children, please speak to your child's class teacher.
