

Topic Vocabulary

materials - Materials are what objects are made from.

suitability - Suitability means having the properties which are right for a specific purpose.

properties - This is what a material is like and how it behaves (soft, hard, waterproof).

hard - Not easily broken or bent.

soft - If something is soft, it is easy to cut, fold or change shape.

stretchy - Can be pulled to make it wider or longer without breaking.

shiny - Reflects light easily.

dull - Doesn't reflect light. Doesn't look bright or shiny.

rough - It feels bumpy and uneven.

smooth - Has no lumps or bumps.

bendy - Can be bent easily into a curved or folded shape.

rigid - Cannot be bent easily and is not flexible.

waterproof - It keeps water out and keeps things dry.

absorbent - It soaks liquid up.

transparent - Object that can be seen through.

opaque - Object that can't be seen through.

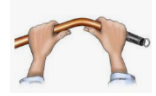
Uses of Everyday Materials

Science facts to learn

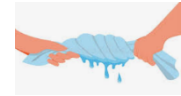
You can **squash** an object by pushing both hands together.



You can **bend** an object by grabbing both ends of an object and bringing the ends inward together.



You can **twist** an object by turning your hands in opposite directions.



You can **stretch** an object by pulling your hands slowly and apart.



wood: hard, stiff, opaque, strong and can be carved into any shape.



glass: waterproof, transparent, hard and smooth.



plastic: waterproof, strong, can be made flexible or stiff, smooth or rough.



metal: strong, hard and easy to wash.
