

Topic Vocabulary

life processes - These are things that all living things do. They move, breathe, sense, grow, make babies, get rid of waste and get their energy from food.

living - Things that are living have all the life processes.

dead - Things that are dead were once living. They did have all the life processes but don't now.

never living - Things made out of metal, plastic or rock were never living. They never had the life processes.

food chain - A food chain shows how each animal gets its food. Food chains are one of the ways that living things depend on each other to stay alive.

food sources - This is the place a living thing's food comes from.

habitat - is a place that an animal lives. It provides the animal with food, water and shelter.

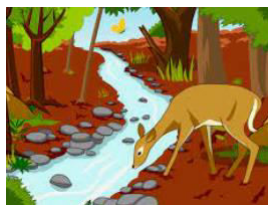

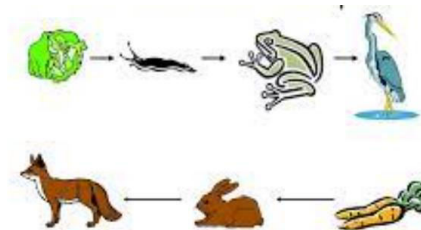
Living Things and their Habitats



Science facts to learn

Food chains

The arrow means 'eaten by'



A herbivore is an animal that only eats plants.

A carnivore is an animal that only eats meat.

An omnivore is an animal that eats plants and animals.

A predator is an animal that hunts and eats other animals.

Prey is an animal that is hunted and eaten by another animal.

Animals can live in different habitats. A habitat is a natural environment that animals live in. Some examples of different habitats are the Arctic, woodlands, ponds, oceans, rivers, deserts, rainforests and underground.

Home Learning Challenge Ideas

Can you create a poster or fact file of one or more habitats to show what it is like there and which animals live in it?

Can you create a poster or a fact file to explain different food chains and how they work?

Can you paint, draw a collage a habitat with the animals you would find there? You might like to do some artwork of an ocean, the Arctic, the rainforest or some woodland.
