Explorer- An explorer is someone who travels to places which very little is known to discover what it is like there.

Explore- If you explore a place you travel around it to find out what it is like.

The Solar System - The Solar System is the sun and all the planets that go around.

The moon - the moon is the object that you can often see in the sky at night. It goes round the Earth once every four weeks.

A planet - a planet is a large, round object in space that moves around a star. The Earth is a planet.

Astronaut- an astronaut is a person who is trained for travelling in a spacecraft.

Pilot- A pilot is a person who is trained to fly an aircraft like an aeroplane or helicopter.

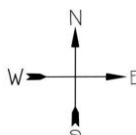

History Facts to learn

On 16th July, 1969, Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins launched into space and Neil Armstrong was the first man to step on the moon on 20th July.

On 12th October, 1492, Christopher Columbus spotted a small island in the Bahamas that he named San Salvador. When he returned, he brought back some of the things he had found such as pineapple.

In May 1932, Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. Sadly, on 2nd July, due to bad weather and low fuel, they tried to land but they never made it.
