What will my child be learning?

This term we will be learning about 'South Africa.' This term we will be learning all about South Africa. We will be using maps to find out where it is and learn about the continents and oceans around the world. We will also be finding out about a very important person called Nelson Mandela and which animals live in the wild there. We have planned an exciting visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park on Thursday 12th October and we will give out more details later this half term in a separate letter. Our focus in Science will be all about "Taking Care". We have planned an exciting visit to Eureka on Thursday 9th November. Later on this year one of our topics will be 'Explorers' and we will explore The Solar System and famous explorers.. In the final term our topic is 'The Seaside' and we even get to visit Scarborough!

History Facts to learn about Nelson Mandela

He was born on 18th July 1918 in a small village in South Africa.

As he grew up, he noticed that black people were treated unfairly.

In 1964, he was sent to prison on Robben Island for life for protesting.

In 1990, he was finally released after 27 years. In 1994, black people in South Africa were finally allowed to vote for the first time.

Nelson Mandela was elected as the first black president of South Africa.

Who can I speak to?

Where can I find out about events in school?

Class pages are updated regularly on the school website showing photos and updates of what your children have been learning about in school. We also have an Awards page to celebrate certificate winners each week.

Texts are sent home via my school app so please make sure you are signed up to this.



What happens before and after school?

All children will wait on the playground accompanied by an adult.

We ask that no ball games are played before or after school and children must not play on the adventure trail or climb on the walls, ensuring safety of pupils and adults.

Class teachers will come out to collect their class at 8:45am and children will line up.

At home time, classes will be brought out via the year 2 door and teachers will allow them to leave when they see a parent/carer.

What do I do if my child is being collected by someone else?

Please contact the office to inform us if someone other than a parent or carer is collecting your child that day.

What can my child bring to school?

Children are asked to bring a water bottle into school each day. We ask that these contain water (no sugary drinks are allowed).

Children should bring their home learning diary to school each day- please record any home learning and reading completed at home in these. Teachers or Teaching assistants will check these weekly.
