Democracy- A country which is ruled by the people through elected representatives.

Reign- The time a King or Queen is on the throne and rules the country.

Tudor Timeline

1485	Henry Tudor defeats Richard III at the Battle of Bosworth.
1485	Henry VII crowned King at Westminster Abbey.
1486	Henry VII marries Elizabeth of York, uniting two houses and ending the War of the Roses.
1509	Henry VII dies and is succeeded by his younger son Henry VIII. Two months after becoming King, he marries Catherine of Aragon (from Spain).
1516	Mary I is born.
1533	Henry VIII marries Anne Boleyn, following a divorce from Catherine of Aragon. Anne Boleyn gives birth to Elizabeth.
1534	Henry VIII forms the Church of England, separating England from the Roman Catholic Church.
1536	Anne Boleyn is executed and 11 days later Henry marries Jane Seymour.
1537	Finally, Henry has a male heir- Edward is born but a few days later his mother (Jane) dies.
1547	Henry VIII dies and is succeeded by his son Edward VI.
1553	Edward VI dies and is succeeded by Jane Grey. Her reign only lasts 9 days. Mary I becomes Queen.
1554	Mary marries Phillip of Spain.
1558	Mary dies and Elizabeth I is crowned Queen.
1564	William Shakespeare is born.
1591	William Shakespeare's first play is performed.
1603	Queen Elizabeth I dies ending the Tudor period.
