Historical Facts to Learn

Houses tell us something about the people who built them and the times in which they lived.

Houses from the past have similarities and differences to houses today.

People used to live in caves but over time they learned to build their own shelters, and then homes.

The Celtic tribes built roundhouses made from wood and straw, stuck on with mud.

The Tudor houses were made from wood and the spaces in between were filled using small sticks and wet clay.

In Victorian times people could build their houses using materials from anywhere.
