Summer term

This term we will be learning all about Contrasting Localities. We will be looking at the key human and physical features of Leeds and the Lake District. Home-school diaries

P.E.

Our P.E. days are:

On these days, **please send your child to school wearing a suitable P.E. kit.** Most PE sessions will be outdoors this term so they will need suitable footwear and clothing. Children should not wear crop tops or footwear that is not suitable for sporting activities e.g. flip flops. On P.E. days we ask that earrings are removed if possible.

Wednesdays will be swimming - Please ensure your child brings their swimming kit and towel with them every week.

Water bottles

Please send your child to school with a named water bottle every day. Their bottles must only have water in them to drink during the day.

Homework

Spellings will be sent home every Monday to learn at home for a test in school. (Class 9 will have a test of Friday, Class 10 will have a test on Thursday) Please help your child to practise these everyday using the spelling sheets. Maths homework will be sent home on Mondays and will be expected to be returned completed by the following Monday. We also encourage children to read at least three times a week at home. Reading books are available to children in school to take home to read.
