

Year 6 Newsletter

Welcome back! We hope you have all enjoyed the summer holidays and are excited to be back in school for Year 6.

Autumn term

This term, we will be **learning all about France**, looking at what France is like today as well as the history of the French Revolution. We will be using our history skills to research the revolution, looking into guillotines and the price of bread! We will also be using our geography skills to locate France on world and European maps as well as learning all about its landscape. Finally, we will experience some French culture, learning vocabulary and tasting French cuisine.

Home-school diaries

All children have received a new home school diary this week. They are filled with lots of information to help support your child's learning at home. Please help your child to look after these and make sure they are in school every day. We'd love to see any reading, homework or extra learning your child has done at home recorded each week. Your child will be rewarded with stamps and stickers in their diary as well as **prizes for consistent home learning!**

P.E.

Our P.E. day is **Monday (Class 13)** and **Thursday (Class 14)** every week this half term. On these days, **please send your child to school wearing a suitable P.E. kit**. Most sessions will be outdoors so they will need trainers or plimsolls, jogging bottoms/loose shorts, a t-shirt and a jumper. Children should not wear crop tops or footwear that is not suitable for sporting activities e.g. flip flops. On P.E. days we ask that earrings are removed if possible.

Water bottles

Please send your child to school with a named water bottle every day. Their bottles must only have water in them to drink during the day.

Reading books

Your child will bring home a reading book of their choice. When they have finished it, they simply need to let an adult know to change it. **Your child should read at least three times a week** and this should be **recorded in the home school diary**. Year 6 children can fill in how many pages they have read of their book themselves if they wish or adults at home can fill it in - it is up to you! It could be nice to have a mixture of independent reading and reading to an adult, but do whichever works for you. In class we keep a record of home reading and children will receive a prize and a certificate every half term for reading three times a week.

Homework

Spellings will be sent home every Monday to learn at home for a test in school on Friday. Please help your child to practise these everyday using the 'Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check' sheet. Your child will receive a raffle ticket for returning this completed on a Friday. **Maths homework will be sent home on Thursdays** and if brought back on Friday, your child would also receive a raffle ticket. If your child has not completed their minimum home learning for the week, they will need to stay in for part of their Friday break time to catch up on this. There will also be opportunities during lunchtimes for your child to complete their home learning tasks and read to an adult.
