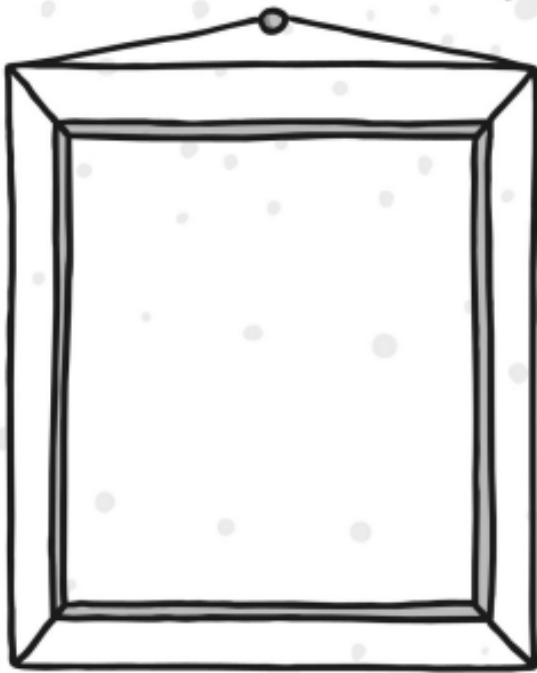

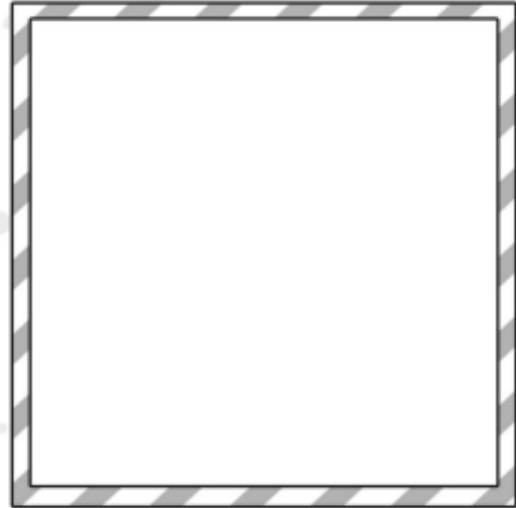

Snowy-Day Activity Ideas

Investigate snowflakes – can you find two that look the same?

black tray or black paper, magnifying glass



Create snow art.

paint or food colouring, paintbrushes/pipettes



Build an igloo. Then, sit inside with blankets and a warm drink.

blankets, warm milk or warm hot chocolate



Make snowballs of different sizes. You could attempt to build a snowball tower or throw snowballs at a target.



Instead of a mud kitchen, create a snow kitchen!

pans, bowls, cups, spoons, whisks



Melting challenge – collect cups of snow and attempt to either stop the snow melting or make the snow melt as fast as possible.



Build a snowman, snow child, snow animal or snow building.

hat, buttons, carrot, natural materials, ribbons, clothing



Explore making footprints in the snow and create different footprint trails.

shoes of different sizes and with different soles



Create snowcastles.

bucket, spade, windmill



Try mark making or writing in and on the snow.

feet, sticks, giant paintbrushes, pom-poms, lolly sticks

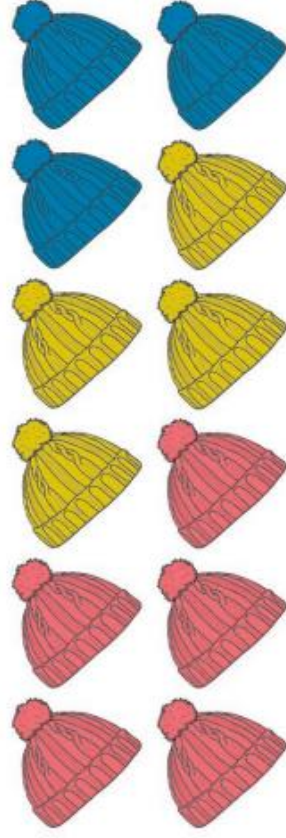


Jenna was baking some cookies. She made 9 on Monday and 12 on Tuesday.
